Incorporate processes of gap identification into each task force work plan.

Reduce Obstacles to Successful Reentry



• **Develop** strategies that address obstacles in identified key areas such as housing, transportation, prosocial activities, and employment.

Educate the Public on Reentry Issues



- **Use** resources such as email, social media, and the coalition website to post educational information about criminal justice reform and reentry topics.
- Present information on reentry topics in public forums.
- Facilitate Reentry Simulations for groups.

Provide Resources



- Respond to requests for information about our coalition and area reentry services.
- Collect and distribute Care Packages to returning individuals in need of basic care items.
- Establish Successful Returning Individuals (SRI) support group.

Advocate for Change



- Attend Pennsylvania Reentry Council (PARC) meetings.
- **Present** coalition members with opportunities to advocate for returning individuals and families
- Support initiatives that address identified gaps and obstacles.
